

Title: Setting Love in Order: Hope and Healing for the Homosexual

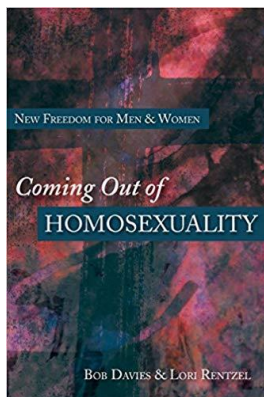

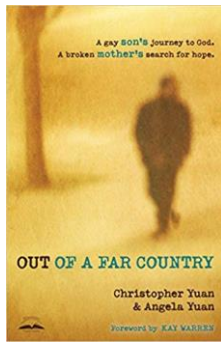
Title: Coming Out of Homosexuality: New Freedom for Men and Women

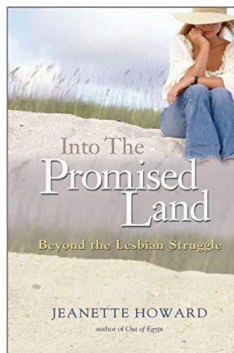

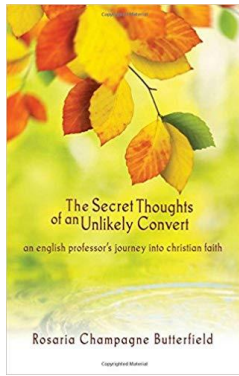
Title: Into the Promised Land: Beyond the Lesbian Struggle

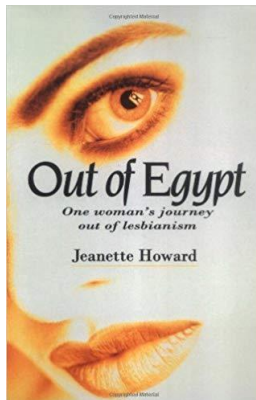

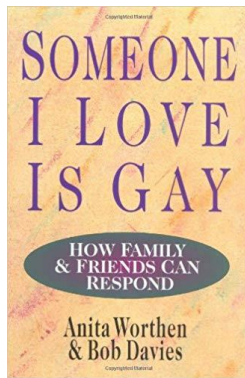
Title: Out of Egypt: One Woman's Journey out of Lesbianism

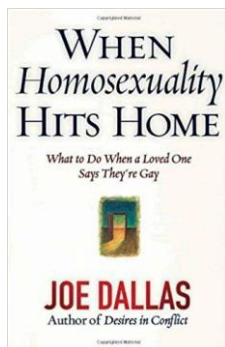

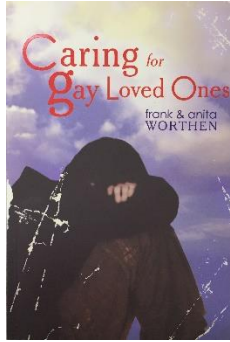
Title: When Homosexuality Hits Home: What to Do When a Loved One Says They're Gay

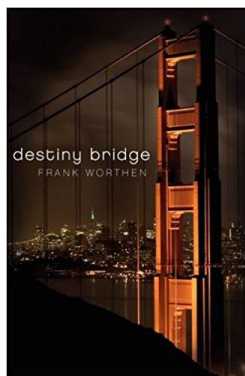
Title: Caring for Gay Loved Ones

Title: Destiny Bridge: A Journey out of Homosexuality

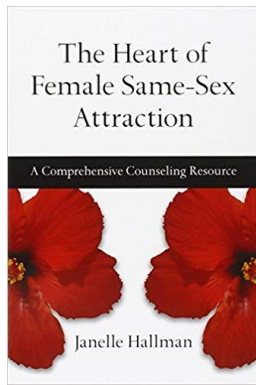

'If you are willing to take your life, are you willing to give it to Me?' Frank tells compassionately of how God took him onto an amazing journey out of homosexuality.



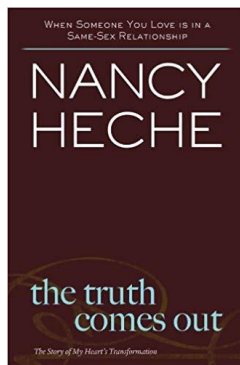
Title: The Heart of Female Same-Sex Attraction: A Comprehensive Counseling Resource
